

HOW TO REACH THE VENUE FROM CHARLES DE GAULLE – ROISSY AIRPORT

RAIL NETWORKS



The station “Aéroport Charles de Gaulle 1” serves terminals 1 & 3. The “Aéroport Charles de Gaulle 2 – TGV” serves terminals 2 ACDEF & G. Terminal 2G is linked to terminal 2F by the free N2 shuttle.

⇒ **From Roissy Charles de Gaulle take RER B (regional line) to Saint Michel station.**

⇒ **Then take subway line 10 to Jussieu.**

Journey time: allow 35-40 min (RER) for a journey from the airport to the centre of Paris. 5-10 min additional time to get to the Jussieu metro station

Fare: €9.75

Citymapper is a useful app for real-time all public transport times, maps and directions

The taxi company G7 operates in the whole Paris region. They also can come and pick you up at the airport. Booking orders or quotes can be made by phone (+33 1 41 27 66 99) or through the website or the app. All cars accept credit cards from 15 euros. HOW TO REACH THE VENUE FROM ORLY AIRPORT

RAIL NETWORKS

Paris-Orly connects to the RER C station «Pont de Rungis» by the bus service «GO C Paris».

GO C Paris shuttle bus stops at Paris- Orly:
 Orly 4: gate 47, stop 5
 Orly 1-2: gate 15, stop 7

Directions:

From «Pont de Rungis» towards Paris
 ⇒ take the train labelled GOTA or NORA in the "Pontoise" or "Montigny Beauchamp" direction and alight at **Gare d'Austerlitz**.
 ⇒ at Gare d'Austerlitz, take the 10 metro line in the *Boulogne Pont de Saint-Cloud* direction and get off at **Jussieu** station
 ⇒ alternatively take the n°89 bus outside the Gare d'Austerlitz station (Jardin des Plantes, Hôpital Pitié Salpêtrière exit) in the *Gare de Vanves-Malakoff* direction and get off at **Jussieu** stop

For the return journey, from Paris towards Pont de Rungis take trains heading in the Massy – Palaiseau or Pont de Rungis direction

Journey time: 10 min (bus) + 25 min (RER) + 10 min (metro/bus)

Fare: €6.35



Paris-Orly is linked to the RER B station « Antony » by the ORLYVAL shuttle train.

ORLYVAL shuttle train stops at Paris-Orly:
 Orly 4: entrance 48
 Orly 1-2: entrance 14 Arrival level

Directions:

From « Antony » towards Paris
 ⇒ take the train in the "Mitry-Claye" or "Aéroport Charles de Gaulle" direction and alight at Cluny La Sorbonne station
 ⇒ change for the 10 metro line in the *Gare d'Austerlitz* direction and alight at **Jussieu** station

Journey time: 25 min (RER) + 8 min (ORLYVAL)
Fare : € 10.90 (RER+Orlyval)

Tramway (7):

The tram line 7 connects the Villejuif-Louis Aragon terminus of the n°7 metro line.

Journey time:

The approximate travel time is around 29 minutes and further 15 min to get to the **Jussieu** station. Total travel time: 50 min.

Fare: € 3.80

BUS



The Orlybus shuttle provides a link between Paris-Orly and Paris (Denfert-Rochereau station).

Stops for Orlybus at Paris-Orly:

To Paris: pier number 5 Orly 4 (close to door 47d)

Journey time: 25 - 30 min

Fare: €8,70

Then take RER B at Denfert-Rochereau (trains in the "Mitry-Claye" or "Aéroport Charles de Gaulle" direction and alight at Luxembourg, take the n°89 bus in the *Porte de France* direction and get off at the **Institut du Monde Arabe** stop

HOW TO GET TO THE VENUE FROM THE GARE DE L'EST STATION:

By bus: Take the direct line No. 47, from the "Gare de l'est" bus stop, which is located on the esplanade of the Gare de l'Est Station, in the "Fort du Kremlin Bicêtre" direction. Alight at the "Cardinal Lemoine", "Place Monge" or "Les Gobelins" bus stop, all of which are at a 5 minute distance by foot from the University.

By metro: Take the direct line N. 7 direction "**Mairie d'Ivry**" or "**Villejuif Louis Arragon**" and get off at "**Jussieu**".

HOW TO GET TO THE VENUE FROM THE GARE DE LYON STATION:

By bus: Take the direct line No. 63. from "**Gare de Lyon**" bus stop in the "**Porte de la Muette**" direction. Alight at the "**Institut du Monde Arabe**" bus stop, which is at a 5 minute walking distance from the University. The journey takes approx. 15 minutes

PUBLIC TRANSPORT TICKETS

Tickets can be purchased at the ticket office, at the ticket vending machines (in metro, at some bus/tram stops) or from the bus driver (with an extra fee).



The t+ ticket allows you to travel on: metro lines, RER lines (RATP and SNCF) within Paris (zone 1), Ile-de-France bus lines (RATP and OPTILE), except Orlybus and Roissybus, tramway lines (RATP and SNCF) and the Montmartre funicular. €1,90 individually



The Paris Visit travel card grants full, unrestricted access to all public transport in the Ile-de-France region. The Paris Transport pass is valid for **1, 2, 3 or 5 consecutive days in zones 1 to 3 (close suburbs) or in zones 1 to 5 included airports CDG/Orly and Versailles**. Each day begins at 00:00 and ends at 00:00 the following day.

PARIS MUST-KNOW

WEATHER

October and November are cold months to visit Paris, the weather tends to be wet and the temperatures are low. During these months, the average temperature starts off at 9.5°C on November 1st and drops down to 5.5°C by November 30th. Throughout November, Paris is subject to an average of 22mm of rainfall. Moderate rain is the most expected type of rainfall for this month. This precipitation is spread across 15 days throughout the month, which means it's highly likely that you'll experience a shower or two during your visit, **so make sure you pack an umbrella**.

VISITING PARIS

SIGHTSEEING RECOMMENDATIONS

Just as you could imagine, Paris has something to offer for everyone. There is always something exciting to do in the magical, mythical and sometimes surprising capital.

Around the meeting place : The Latin Quarter, Ile de la Cité and Ile Saint Louis are the historic heart of Paris.

Discover the sublime series of stained-glass windows of Sainte-Chapelle

Next to the Palais de Justice, Sainte-Chapelle and the Conciergerie are the precious remains of what was once the palace of the Kings of France from the 10th to the 14th century.

Walk past private mansion houses on the Ile Saint Louis

The Pont Saint-Louis marks the beginning – often with music – of tranquility of sumptuous mansion houses. A refuge for artists, the Ile Saint-Louis is also a haven for gourmets.

Walk around the Latin Quarter

From the Panthéon which dominates the Latin Quarter, to the Arènes de Lutèce (in the 1st and 2nd centuries BC, this amphitheater held up to 15,000 people, who came to see plays, comedies, gladiator combats and wild beasts fighting) via the small paved Place de la Contrescarpe.

You can visit one of the favorite walks of Parisians since 1640: the Muséum national d'histoire naturelle. It is set within over 2" hectares of plants and trees and harmoniously combines the natural sciences with crêpes and sweets kiosks.

Maximum 15 minutes by metro:

Take a gentle stroll between the Place du Châtelet and Place des Vosges to enjoy a spot of shopping or discover local heritage.

The Marais district combines a whirl of creative design with the delights of the Jewish Quarter, and magnificently preserved historic center. Busy streets give way to tiny squared and gardens and numerous museums (Carnavalet, Picasso, National Archives, Maison Victor Hugo, Hôtel de Sully).

Admire the dome of the Opera House, the rue Royale and rue de la Paix, the diamonds of Place Vendôme, and the gardens of the Palais-Royal.

The Peaceful Palais-Royal houses the Ministry of Culture and several institutions, some chic boutiques, gourmet restaurants and a garden planted with four rows of lime trees. You can also see the striped Buren Columns.

Go for greenery in the Luxembourg gardens, don't miss art and antiques galleries in Saint Germain and let yourself be enchanted by the wonderful Musée d'Orsay.

The Café de Flore, the Deux-Magots and the Brasserie Lipp make up the golden triangle of the boulevard and place Saint-Germain and were once the "Headquarters" of Sartre and Beauvoir amongst others, as well as an antechamber for politics and a second "office" for publishers.

Maximum 35 by metro:

Climb the stairs of The Butte Montmartre and stroll Place du Tertre with its restaurant terraces and artists 'easels and portrait painters.

Sacré-Coeur, at the top of Montmartre is surrounded by a labyrinth of extraordinary little streets and a vineyard. Right down the Butte, from Place d'Anvers to Place de Clichy, you will find Pigalle and the Moulin Rouge.

Walk from the Tour Eiffel to the Invalides and enjoy spectacular views.

A not-to-be-missed monument and symbol of the capital, the Eiffel Tower stands 324 m tall, and weighs 10,100 tons. The Trocadéro esplanade, named the Parvis des Libertés et des Droits de l'Homme (square of freedom and human rights), offers the most panoramic view of the Eiffel Tower gardens. This square is also the crossroads between the Musée de l'Homme and the Palais de Chaillot. *Escape and enjoy the smile of Mona Lisa, the hieroglyphs at the Place de la Concorde and talk a walk on the Champs Élysées to the Arc de Triomphe. Midway between the Arc de Triomphe and the Concorde, stop and admire the Grand Palais, an impressive stone building crowned with a splendid metallic-framed glass roof.*

RESTAURANTS & CAFÉS

Le Procope

In the 18th century, it was a seedbed for liberal ideas and the history of the Encyclopædia is intimately linked to that of Procope where Diderot, d'Alembert and Benjamin Franklin could be seen. During the Revolution, Robespierre, Danton and Marat met here and where Lieutenant Bonaparte left his hat as a pledge. Today, the Procope is emerging from the great shadows of its history. Symbol of the past, Voltaire's table testifies to permanency, while preparing the way for new pages of glory.

Subway – line 10 or 4 – Odéon
